

## Creative Credit & Copyright

We live in a “copy and paste” world. Technology makes it easy to copy and paste words, phrases and pictures with just a few clicks. Did you know that it is against the law to copy and paste someone else’s work and present it as your own? This is called plagiarism.

When you create your own story, poem, song, drawing or project you automatically own the copyright to it. Copyright is a type of protection given to authors and illustrators so others cannot use their creations without their permission. Authors can grant the right for others to use their creations by writing an agreement. Often times authors request users to give credit on or at the end of their project. Therefore, it is very important to cite your sources when you write a paper, create a project or give a presentation. When you are researching a topic to use in a paper or presentation, be sure to take notes and then form sentences in your own words. It is so easy to plagiarize without even knowing it!
