A <u>parody song</u> is when someone replaces original song lyrics with lyrics of their own. The purpose is usually humor.

Some parodies change almost all of the lyrics. Some parodies only change a small amount of the lyrics. Sometimes artists rewrite parodies of their own songs! Read some examples of parody lyrics below.
